
is beginning to show improvement. Please join us in prayer for a miracle for Jose Manuel.



Having seen the growth in our first marriage group, we have had it on our hearts to open one for young marrieds in their 20's and early 30's! This coming week we will have our second meeting with them! We're



super excited to be able to work with them in their first years of marriage where they are making big decisions and developing habits.



Each year in the past we have taken a group to Colonet for a Christmas program, a feast and a blessing of gifts for the indigenous children in the hot-meal program there. This year things were different. Because of Covid, we couldn't all be together. Pablo, two of our youth and the Ramlo's from Taft Avenue Community church traveled down and made a very special delivery! The following Saturday, the leaders there held the party for the children.
