

Dear family and friends,


It has now been 6 months that we have been in quarantine, as you all have been. We have gone through the emotional ups and downs of being at home constantly, seeing the people that we minister to only through Zoom... keeping up with our responsibilities here on the field with a completely different way of doing things. It has been a bittersweet time. We have gotten caught up with things that we only dreamed of being able to do... We haven't travelled during these months, so we have been able to recoup our physical fatigue... We are deeply missing the "in-person" interaction with people... We have watched as 4 pastors in our community have died (3 from COVID), 3 worship leaders in the community have been hospitalized and intubated – 1 living and the other 2 passing away... A nurse from our church family died... Three complete families in our church getting sick with COVID, one right after the other, but all having non-severe cases...and we watched and waited and prayed with each of these people and their families – sometimes grieving with them and other times rejoicing...

### Our small group




Our church, our marriage counseling, our small group and the youth have all moved to Zoom! People are growing, and it is surprising how deep our conversations and teaching time can get while looking at the computer screen! We thank God for technology that has allowed us to be in a world where our isolation is not complete.

At our church, the majority of our members do not have Wi-Fi in their homes – but social media such as Facebook is a freebie when you buy data for your phone. So, we use Zoom for the actual service, and mostly only a few families are on live together, but the remainder of the church family watches the livestream on FB. At the end of every service there is much throwing of kisses and hugs as we say goodbye.



Our church will not go back to live services until our city is at Green light... which seems a long way off as all the border cities remain in Red due to the continual crossing of people on the border and the lack of a slowing in cases.



Pablo's men's group has not been able to meet because the men that met together, for the most part, do not have Wi-Fi. So instead, Pablo has been calling them on a regular basis to ask them about their lives and the situations they are facing. He encourages them. He prays with them.

The city still has not allowed team sports to begin so all of Pablo's soccer players are "waiting at the gates" for the go ahead!

We steadfastly believe that though the world is in physical and political unrest, we are to use this time to pray more, to be in His word, to invest in people in a smaller, more intimate way... and to wait.
